Hello spring! Warm weather is quickly approaching, and we are excited to get outside and do some fun outdoor activities with your children. We have spent so much time indoors and will be excited to spend time outside enjoying the weather and the many things we can observe in the spring! The children will continue to strengthen growing muscles when they are climbing, running, playing ball and jumping. During the month of April the children will be learning about flowers, plants, trees, the earth, and birds. These learning experiences will allow each child to expand their math, science, language and communication skills.



Summer Program Billing

You will notice a few changes to your bill that gets sent out on April 30. If you have chosen to apply your deposit to your May bill, you will see that credit on your May tuition bill, which is due on May 7 as usual. You will also see a charge for the summer programs for which you have signed up. The **summer program tuition is due in full by May 15**. Please be aware, if you have autopay enabled in Brightwheel, the summer tuition amount will be automatically deducted on May 15.

Fall Enrollment

For those coming back next year, enrollment statements will be in your folders soon. We still have a few spots available for the 2024-2025 school year and would love to talk with your friends and neighbors so feel free to spread the word. Remember we have a referral bonus program if you do tell someone about us and they enroll. We are still enrolling for our Spanish Immersion Classroom, but it's filling up fast.

2024-2025 School Year

The 2024-2025 school year will look slightly different. There will be changes in teachers in the classrooms as well as the age groups in the classrooms. We will continue to operate all four classrooms; one toddler classroom (2 yrs. to 3 yrs. old) two mixed-age preschool classrooms (3 yrs. to 5 yrs. old) and our new mixed-age Spanish Immersion classroom (3 yrs. to 5 yrs. old). Mixed-age classrooms will offer amazing benefits to children such as learning from each other, leadership skills, developing self-esteem, improving social-emotional skills, developing self-concept, empathy, language, literacy, and cognitive skills. In this new model, the teachers will break the classroom into two groups, and each teacher will guide/teach that group during structured times and activities so that they can move along to the next stage of learning and development. We will continue to provide a span of materials and activities to promote their learning and development as an individual and as a group. If you have any questions, please talk to Ms. Maria.

Health & Safety

We would like to remind all our families that if your child experiences any communicable disease (lice, COVID-19, chickenpox, measles, pertussis, and meningitis) at home, we need to be informed since it is a licensing requirement to inform all parents of the children in the specific classroom of the exposure. Also if your child experiences fever, diarrhea, or vomiting in order to return to school they must be symptom-free for 24 hours without the use of any medication.
