Three days each week, teacher-directed lessons—such as circle time, science experiments, math, art, and music and movement—will be conducted primarily in Spanish. This immersive approach fosters natural language acquisition and encourages students to use Spanish in meaningful, everyday contexts.

Language and literacy activities, including writing, reading, rhyming, and singing, will be presented in both English and Spanish. This dual-language approach supports students in developing strong foundations in both languages, enhancing their communication skills and literacy development.
